DIOCESAN K-12 RE SYLLABUS

About the Diocesan K-12 Religion Syllabus

The K-12 Religion Syllabus attempts to retell the story of Jesus and the Church, using language intelligible to young people of the 21st Century. The Syllabus has focus on the Catholic story in the larger context of the wider world, thus issues related to justice, morality and building a better world are explored in dialogue with the Catholic Christian context. Many students will obviously be hearing the Christian Story for the first time, not in a church or at home, but in a classroom.

The K-12 Religion Syllabus therefore has as its fundamental aim to enhance or promote knowledge and understanding of the Catholic Community: its story, its experiences and its teachings. This is done through the exploration of four main strands, woven across the years or stages, and based on the Catechism of the Catholic Church. These strands are: Jesus and Scripture, History and Beliefs, Celebration and Prayer, Justice and Morality.

A comprehensive and developing list of Religion learning outcomes arranged in Stages (from Early Stage 1 to Stage 6- see Syllabus) and based on the four strands is at the heart of the new Syllabus. These outcomes provide clarity for teachers and parents at each stage and assist in the assessment of Religious knowledge and understanding. A plan (or Scope and Sequence) of topic titles from K-12 has also been developed.

GOALS and AIMS of the CLASSROOM TEACHING of RELIGION

The classroom teaching of religion promotes and understanding of Catholic beliefs and practices, and incorporates content with the same systematic demands, creativity and rigour as other Key Learning Areas

It also takes into account developmental stages and attempts to adapt material appropriate to the students' backgrounds.

The overall goal of classroom religion is expressed in the diocesan policy on The Classroom Teaching of Religion (1999) as:

To enhance or promote knowledge and understanding of the traditions of the Catholic community: its story, its experiences and its teachings, through the following four strands: **Jesus and Scripture, History and Beliefs, Celebration and Prayer, Justice and Morality.**

The classroom teaching of religion aims to:

- 1. Encourage students to find meaning and excitement in learning about the story, experiences and teachings of the Catholic tradition
- 2. Enable students to be more articulate and thoughtful about the Catholic tradition
- 3. Encourage informed participation of students in the Catholic community
- 4. Enable students to know, understand and apply Gospel values in daily life.

The Four Strands:

The four strands *Jesus and Scripture, History and Beliefs, Celebration and Prayer, Justice and Morality,* are based generally on the structure of *the Catechism of the Catholic Church* and are central to the living Catholic tradition. The *Catechism* is thus a key reference text in the development of the syllabus. The four strands are systematically developed using contemporary language and sources.

JESUS and SCRIPTURE: God's love is revealed especially in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus and communicated primarily through the Scriptures

HISTORY and BELIEFS: God acts through the church community whose central beliefs are expressed in the Creed.

CELEBRATION and PRAYER: The Church community celebrates its relationship with God through the Sacraments and through communal and personal prayer

JUSTICE and MORALITY: Christians are called to live just and moral lives and to respect the whole of creation.
